- Build partnerships with other countries outside of the US-led orbit, such as Russia and China.

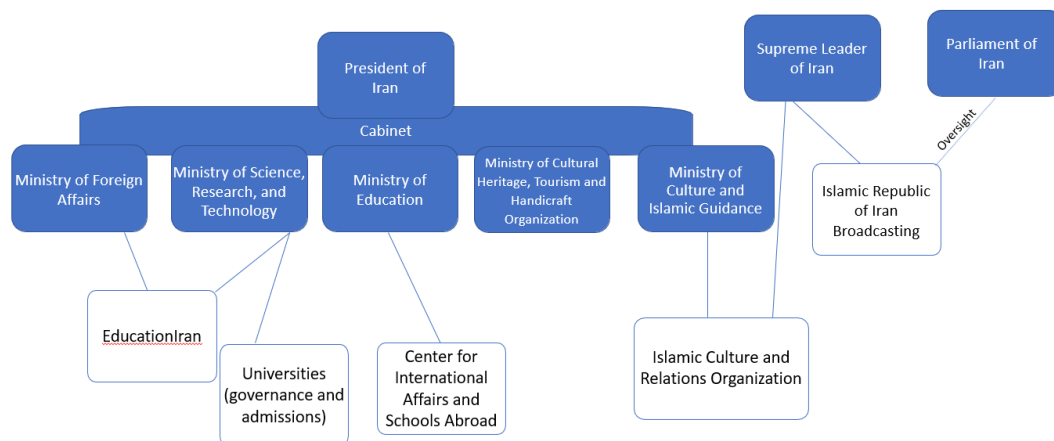
POLICY CONTEXT
